Distribution update

Rachael Naylor, Director of Distribution and Operations

- We have completed our root cause analysis of the April distribution and our assurance plan for the July distribution, which resulted in much more accurate distribution payments
- We are currently working on an end-to-end distribution assurance plan, review and optimisation
- The issues we identified during April and some more historic errors have been mitigated by new processes introduced and we will continue to seek to improve distribution
- We are implementing more layers of assurance, including more control checks, further finance approval and more reviews
- For the July distribution, we introduced a number of new analytical review points into the process and created new insight tools to allow us to identify and investigate any areas of risk

Anti-piracy update

Sharan Ghuman, Anti-Piracy Unit Manager

Stream-ripping piracy

- 17 stream-ripping download sites have completely shut down following the use of MAPS
- Our collaborative partnership with the City of London Police IP Crime Unit (PIPCU) is assisting in the disruption of stream-ripping services
- 75% of stream-ripping apps we've reported to Apple have either been removed or had their ripping functionality disabled
- Soundcloud is disrupting services which are abusing its API usage, both proactively and in collaboration with us

Copyright update

James Way, Senior Product Owner – Data Policy, ICE Services

- First release of Project Cube was delivered at the end of July to ICE
- ICE is testing the product and completing requirements for the next software releases in October and December
- Go live of new copyright system is planned for Q1 2019
- Data Policy alignment continues with ICE customer societies to ensure adoption of policy (inc. common Counterclaims Policy) ready for go-live
- ICE will meet with customer societies and publishers from September onwards to introduce the changes and validate the design ready for go-live

Digital Transformation update

Tim Arber, Head of Membership Support

- The launch of our Identity Access Management (IAM) tool has been delayed to allow additional testing and assurance work launch planned for Q1 next year
- This will delay the full release of Online Statements, as this product is dependent on IAM to enable access for members it will launch soon after IAM
- Development on Online Statements itself is progressing well we will release a BETA product through our current log in system in Q4 this year

International update

Liam Donnelly, Head of International

Greece

- Is an evolving situation
- Likely to be two competing CMOs: AUTODIA and Government supported EYED
- We have provided a limited mandate to AUTODIA for General Licensing on a trial basis and may add further rights over time subject to performance
- In the interim we plan to license broadcast and major live concert rights directly

Spain

• Difficult situation at SGAE

- Publishers have been expelled from the Board and others are planning to withdraw their rights from January 2019
- In May, SGAE's executive unilaterally revised weighting for overnight music to 20% from 15%, overturning the outcome of the 2017 WIPO arbitration
- Separately, the CISAC investigation into SGAE has largely confirmed issues highlighted by ICMP
- There is pressure from CISAC on SGAE to implement reforms before the end of the year. Failure to do so could result in CISAC applying sanctions

USA

- The Music Modernisation Bill has been making good progress through the House of Representatives and Senate
- However, there is some uncertainty whether Blackstone (owners of SESAC/HFA) intervention will derail the Bill
- The Senate vote is expected before October

PRS International Income performance

- There has been a strong income growth from most regions/sources so far in 2018, however, the strength of sterling has tempered receipts
- Drivers are primarily Online, TV and Live
